Prevalence of physical abuse at home and its associated factors among adolescents in Malaysia: findings from the National Health and Morbidity Survey in 2022





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INTRODUCTION

- Physical abuse among adolescents is a deeply concerning issue that involves the use of force to cause harm or injury to individuals in their teenage years.
- This form of abuse can have significant and long-lasting effects on their physical, emotional, and psychological well-being.
- Recognizing and addressing physical abuse is essential to ensure the safety and well-being of those affected.

OBJECTIVE

This study aimed to determine the prevalence of physical abuse at home among adolescents in Malaysia.

METHOD

- The data was obtained from the National Health and Morbidity 2022, a cross sectional study conducted from June to July 2022.
- An adapted Global School-based Student Health Survey (GSHS) questionnaire was used to collect data from school-going adolescents aged 13-17 years old.
- Prevalence and binary logistic regression analysis were carried out, taking into account the multistage cluster design, using IBM SPSS ver 28.0.

RESULT & DISCUSSION

- This study showed A total of 33,523 respondents participated in the survey with a response rate of 89.4%.
- The prevalence of physical abuse at home among adolescents was 7.5% (n=33107).
- The highest prevalence of physical abuse among adolescent at home were among female (8.14%), age group 13 (10.20%), others ethnicity (9.85%) and those adolescent who having separated/widowed parents (9.45%). (Table 1)
- Multiple logistic regression analysis showed that younger age had higher odds of experiencing physical abused at home.
- Female adolescents (aOR = 1.34, 95% CI = 1.15-1.54) had higher odds of physical abuse at home compared to males.
- There were significant associations between high-risk behaviours such as depression, suicidal attempts, smoking cigarettes, alcohol use, drug use, truancy, physical fights and being bullied in line with findings from Klevens, et al⁵.
- Our study also showed there was no significant associations between physical abuse with ethnicity and marital status of parents.

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CONCLUSION

- The study revealed that the physical abuse at home was associated with mental health problems, substance abuse and problems at school.
- Thus, a comprehensive approach involving schools, professionals, and the community is warranted to address this issue and protect adolescents from physical abuse at home.
